NFRC continues to partner with Habitat for Humanity to provide books and bookcases to families receiving a Habitat for Humanity house. This is a wonderful partnership that allows NFRC to give new books and a new bookcase to each family as they move into their new home. Everyone at NFRC loves books and we want all children to have access to books, not only at school and the library, but at their home.

In 2022-2023, NFRC donated books, bookcases, and book baskets to 7 families (12 children total). So far this year, NFRC has donated books and a bookcase for 5 more families in late July, early August, and September 2023. There are typically one to two house dedications each month. Thank you to Medaille college for donating tons of "like new" books from their reading center to give to families! NFRC continues to purchase the bookcases for this partnership.
